# Serving Christ, Serving Our Community AUGUST 2024

Ever heard of the *Flying Wallendas?* I think I have talked about them before, but their story is so profound and has a lot of truths for us to consider today.

Karl Wallenda had been performing stunts since he was six years old in Germany. He was trained to walk on a high wire, cycle across a tightrope, and balance as part of a seven-man pyramid. For him, it seemed, nothing was impossible.

Wallenda formed a group in 1922, after training with another performer while in his teens. He enlisted his sister, a girlfriend, and a friend of his from school, all of whom had circus training, to join him in creating their traveling balancing act.

The group toured Europe for several years, performing tightrope walking, high wire bicycling, and perfecting a seven-person act in which the group sat on a stacked pyramid of chairs, while high in the air.

He got married, had a family and trained his kids, nieces and nephews to go into the family business. They started performing all over the world....they became known as the flying Wallendas. They were a site to see, I mean a real site to see...and they did it all without a net.

But they become known for their most daring stunt... perfecting a seven-person act in which the group sat on a stacked pyramid of chairs, while high in the air on a tightrope. It was heralded the world over as the most daring stunt ever...without a net. It was incredible...can you imagine...one person sitting on a chair that is balanced on a two inch tightrope strung 300 feet off the ground...that person has a ten foot bar that is holding three other chairs where three family members are sitting and the middle person has a five feet bar where two other family members are sitting on a chair and they have a small bar where one other family member is sitting on a chair...simply astonishing.

Eventually, they were noticed by John Ringling, who hired them almost immediately to perform at the Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey Circus. A few years later, they debuted at Madison Square Garden in New York City to a standing ovation.

However, as impressive as the acts were, they were dangerous as well.

Then, on March 22, 1978, the world watched in horror as Karl Wallenda and some other family members fell to their death. Karl attempted to walk across a high wire strung between the two towers of the Condado Plaza Hotel in San Juan, Puerto Rico, the 73-year-old Wallenda lost his balance, teetering on the wire for 30 heart-stopping seconds before plummeting 10 stories.

Karl Wallenda's death might not have been so highly publicized had it not been for his reputation and the fact that it was broadcast live on television. It was certainly a sad day for the Wallenda family.

Life is a tightrope, isn't it? You have lived long enough by now to know that life is hard...especially the Christian life...living the life of a disciple of Christ in our world today is like walking a tight rope without a net.

What Jesus calls us all to do is almost impossible. You are called to love radically...everybody. People who are different than you, love them. People who annoy you, love them...people who are mean to you, accept them. People who are strange and odd, love them. You are called to forgive wholeheartedly...everybody who hurts or wrongs you...no matter how many times they do it.

And that is hard for anybody...everybody. We see people (good, Christian people) falling off the tight rope all the time...hating, holding grudges.

That is why we have church...that is why we have this place called Ocker Brethren Church...Ocker is our net...it is the place that catches us when we fall. The place where we can go and get some more love...more mercy, or faith... more peace when ours has fallen.

The church, your church, is God's safety net for Christians. Karl died because he didn't have a safety net...I wonder, if we didn't have Ocker, would what would happen to us?

I will see you on Sunday – I think it is going to be a great day!


